Boletes Watching!

On July 16th, Genny Steiner and Sue Poland met in Cambridge and checked out Brundage Res, both ends, Goose Lake and Bear Basin. We found *Amanita vaginata* (cf), many different *Cortinarius* species, three kinds of puffballs, corals, *Xerampelina* sp. and boletes, several different polypores, *Clitocybe* species and a few other kinds of fungi we could not easily identify. With the rain storms in the mountains happening now, hopefully the fall foray in September will have lots of mushrooms.
