What is out in March? Early spring fungi may be if the warmer weather continues. Look along the Boise River and the lower ends of draws in the foothills, Hulls Gulch, etc. If you are in a bird or game reserve area marked as closed part of the year, check the posted dates before entering.

Mascot With a Problem - Bear in Distress - Fruitland, ID

Fruitland Intermediate School opened in the fall of 2007. A student's father used a chain saw to carve this bear from a 10 ft section of Elm log.

This "Grizzly" sits under a covered walkway between 2 exterior windows near the south entrance. The invader has been identified as Oyster mushroom, *Pleurotus pulmonarius*. The mushrooms first started to fruit early spring 2008. Mycelium is in all the bear's cracks.
