*Conocybe sp.* are fruiting in garden beds and in lawns. General rule of caution: Never eat small brown mushrooms growing in lawns. Many are poisonous. All are difficult to identify without a microscope.

Boletes are out in the mountains, but it is dry. We really need three days of rain. Remember, Fire danger remains high. Know where the current fires are and plan your hunting accordingly. Be safe.

The foraying was good considering the cold spring. We found lots of morels at unexpected elevations. We collected plenty of mushrooms to keep Dr. Beug busy. Once again we had good weather on Saturday for collecting.

1. This is a name change, previously B. pinicola
2. Originally thought to be P. carnea. Ginns and LeFavre say incarnata has been reported from the PNW, while carnea has not.
3. Dr. Beug said that the name of this, and many other Morchella from our North America probably will be changing because of this paper: **Taxonomic revision of true morels (Morchella) in Canada and the United States.** Kuo M, Dewsbury DR, O'Donnell K, Carter MC, Rehner SA, Moore JD, Moncalvo JM, Canfield SA, Stephenson SL, Methven A, Volk T.J., Mycologia. 2012 Apr 11., and an earlier, competing one published in French by Phillippe Clowez, for which I cannot find a reference.
4. I checked Index Fungorum, MycoBank, and the ICBN sites. There is no indication of action on this name, so I am leaving it as Verpa, for now, on our list.
